THE SUMMER SCHOOL OUTLINE

WHY

The Summer School WATERSCAPES brings together, in the same practical and ideal framework, cultural heritage and environmental preservation. The main actors involved with these pillar concepts are local communities, who maintain with heritage and environment the deepest relation, as these represent their familiar contexts, the premises and background for their sustainable living.

HOW

The core idea of the Summer School is learning in a cooperative way while **sharing limited resources**. In the context of the Anthropocene we learn that all fundamental resources are limited, and they need to be managed carefully. On the boat, water and space are limited resources, so the first didactic goal is their virtuous and careful sharing.

WHAT

The Summer School focuses on **Water**. Water is the connecting medium, the material link among communities and places, across history and today. Water belongs to everybody, it is alive in its motions and transformations. Water connects heritage sites and environmental emergencies. Water requires that any action is collective, shared, fluid, and global. The Water we intend is a natural resource, and a socio-cultural construct. We decide to rename our methodology, from the classical *fieldwork* approach into a new *water-work* approach.

WHERE

Our **boat** is our living and working space, shared by the community for an entire week. Life on board invites to a deep reflection on the **sustainability of maritime life** and calls for attention to distributed responsibility. **Croatian coasts** as perfect examples of Anthropocene complexity: here identity, history, territories and heritage clash against borders, overexploitation, regulations and scarcity.

The Summer School strength relies in the deep **interaction among academics, students and local communities** who provides a rich variety of data and visions to read the places through a commonly developed perspective.

ITINERARY AND PROGRAMME

The Summer School is articulated through seven daily Seminars and Workshops on board and six Visits on field. The seminars are held by professors and researchers from Italy, Serbia, Croatia and France. All destinations are reached by boat, according to the itinerary, and are introduced by visiting lecturers and local experts. All activities are compulsory, and the participation of students is intended for the full week.



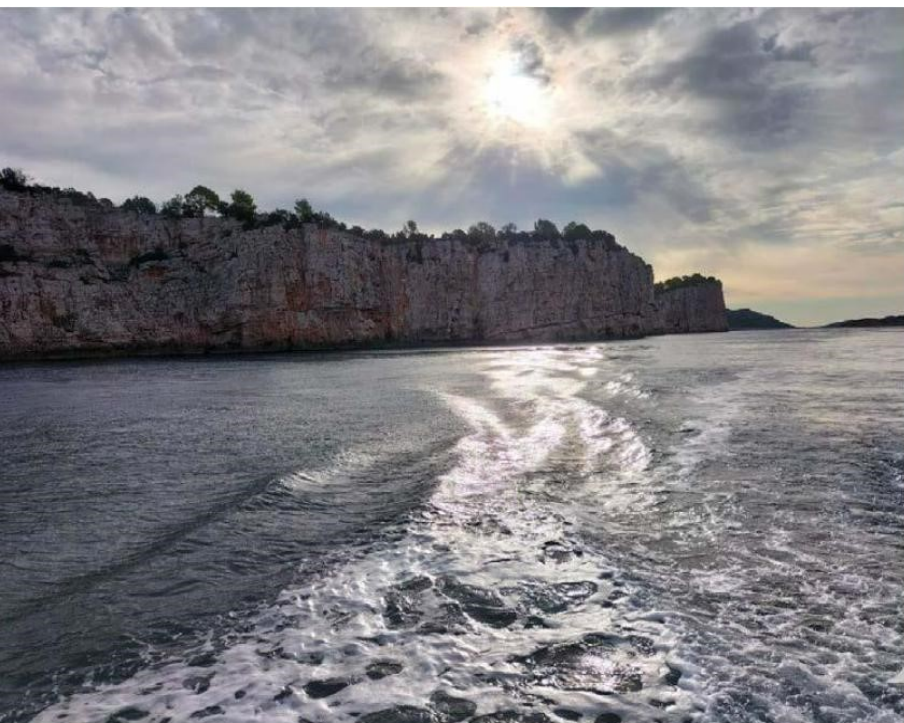

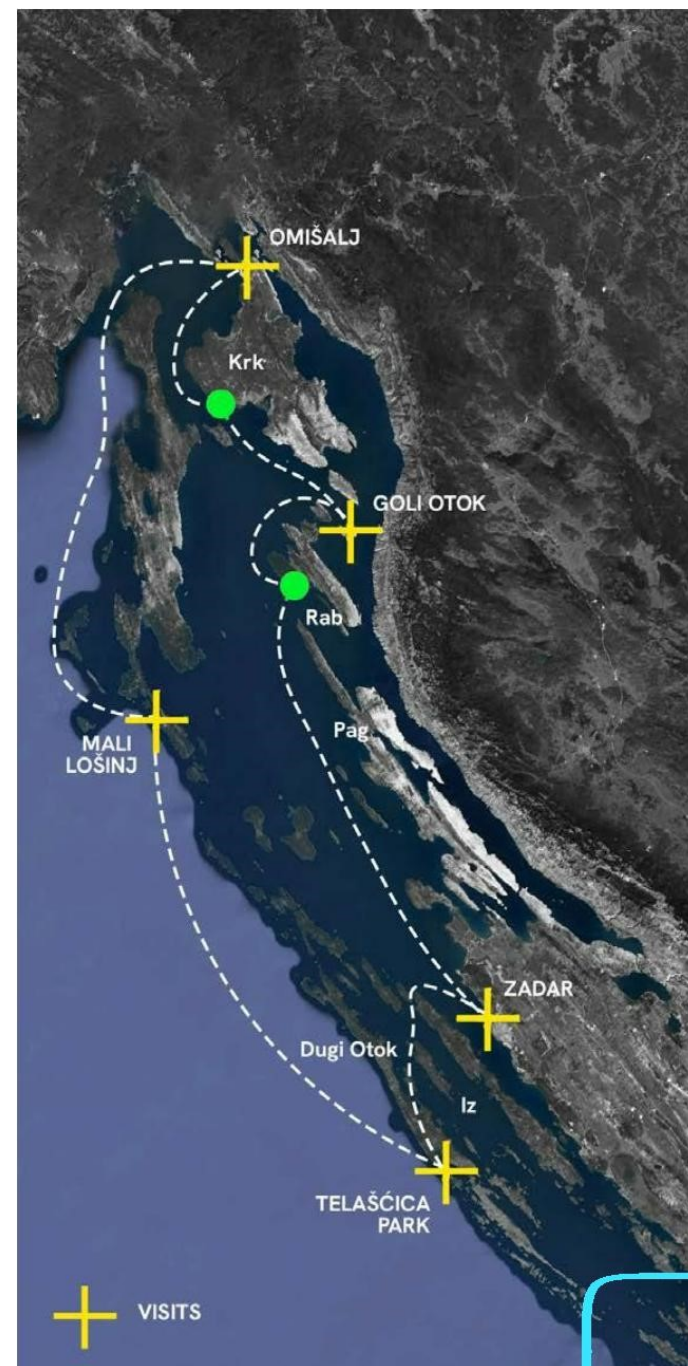

LOGISTICS

The 7-days Summer School WATERSCAPES takes place on board of a dedicated boat, hosting 20 PAX plus the crew.

The boat navigates in the North Adriatic Sea, according to the itinerary established by the Organisers. The students live on board for the entire week, accommodated in double/triple cabins. Two organisers and teaching staff are permanently on the boat, for the entire duration of the Summer School. The rest of teaching staff change according to the program.

The seminars are held on board, in appropriated spaces, indoor and/or outdoor, depending on the weather conditions.

Meals are offered on board and are included in School fee, except dinners, to be organised independently on board or on land.

All visits tickets are included.
